Shaw Trust supports some of the country's most complex children and young people with high-risk behaviour, multiple needs, adverse childhood experiences and trauma, suicide, self-harm, child and criminal exploitation by providing residential homes, fostering and community based support within our communities.


We're answering the acute need for warm and loving homes rooted in the community and support networks with ten new family-sized homes for children in care.


We know that children need trusted, consistent relationships that reach across different aspects of their lives - helping them to understand the impact of their experiences, recover from trauma, and build emotional resilience.


That's why we've put children and young people at the heart of developing our innovative model of care-collaborating with CAMHS and wider health colleagues. And why we've built an integrated support structure which provides a home, tailored education, and expert staff experienced in mental health, therapy and social work.

At any one time, the service will support around 30 children and young people in homes with up to four children. This ensures the care is personalised and individually tailored to meet the needs of each child.

This partnership takes a long-term view in tackling the crisis, delivering high quality services and driving social impact and outcomes. And this approach has the potential to completely transform the way we care for vulnerable children and young people across the country in future.

Supporting adults

Shaw Trust is one of the largest providers of employability programmes supporting jobseekers to gain good work and help businesses to attract, recruit and retain a more diverse workforce, so that:

- Jobseekers are supported to gain good work, through support needs assessment, careers guidance, job search support, vacancy matching and in-work support
- Businesses have a pool of immediately available and motivated candidates that are screened, briefed and ready for interview, work trial or immediate start



Paul's story



Paul was supported by the Intensive Personalised Employment Support (IPES) programme. This DWP programme supports disabled people with complex needs. Here is his story:

After over three years of unemployment, Paul had lost his purpose—he felt lost, devalued, and that his age was stopping him getting into work. His mental health and wellbeing were impacted. He joined IPES to re-build his confidence. During the 14 months Paul was on IPES we focused on supporting Paul's

health and wellbeing with counselling, health at home interventions, strengthening support networks and occupational health support (resulting in a referral for much needed medical support). He now has a one-to-one care plan and is in much better health. After 14 months, Paul began to feel like himself again – emotionally and physically. He felt able to look for work again. Paul was successful, and now works as a Compliance Monitoring Manager – using skills and expertise he feared he'd never use again.
